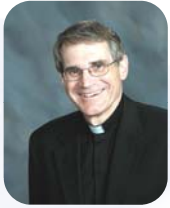

## From Our Pastor



We have “almost” reached our final financial numbers for SAWFest, and they are even better than earlier predictions. The event netted \$115,000 with some very small items to come in yet. Since we budgeted only \$20,000, this is a wonderful boon for us. Now the question of what we will do with it. This is under discussion, and we will be gathering input in the days ahead. But whenever I ponder what I would do with a financial

windfall, it seems wise to save some, invest some, spend some, and give some away. Perhaps the new Christian Cupboard Food Shelf building being erected at Guardian Angels could be one beneficiary. There are a number of small repairs and upkeep issues in our 17 year old building that would be nice to address. We could invest some in ways to build community in the parish, which was the primary purpose of the festival. Some could be seed money for next year’s festival or help support some program that is underfunded. And, of course, we don’t have to spend it all right now. We just got this number on Monday, so watch this column for more information.

Often, in my article I try to teach along with giving news and announcements. This week I would like to present Catholic teaching on “The Common Good.” It is one of the pillars of Catholic Social Teaching, and will be the focus of our next series, “Catholic Teaching for Today: From Prayer to Action. That prayer time will be on Tuesday, November 14<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM.

The Common Good is based on the dignity of all human beings. It is not a socialistic theory where everyone shares equally from a common pot, but, as Pope St. John XXIII wrote, “the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily.” (*Mater et Magistra*) It might be that “some may have to live simply so that others can simply live,” but none are asked to make themselves destitute or be stripped of everything by a government in this teaching.

Beth Haile, in an article in U.S. Catholic (November, 2017, p. 49) likens the Common Good to being on a sports team where individual players want to be as successful as possible, perhaps by scoring lots of points. The ultimate goal of each player, however, is the success of the team, a goal more than the sum of every player’s statistics. A team does not win because each player tries to score as many points as possible. Conditions need to be optimal for each individual player to play well in order for a team to win. The good of both the individual and the team are interdependent.

## From Our Pastor Continued

Supporting the Common Good might involve some personal sacrifice at times, but it is not exalting the whole at the expense of an individual. Rather, it is realizing that they depend on each other. For the common good to be achieved, no one may be sacrificed or disregarded. It is not “the greatest good for the greatest number,” because that will usually exclude someone. The bishops of England and Wales likened it to a multiplication sum, where the total is zero if any of components is zero. No individual is excluded from the common good. It is therefore again linked to the ideas of human dignity and authentic and integral human development, making them central aims of all societies. Other principles of Catholic social teaching function to concretize the common good. The preferential option for the poor, for example, turns our attention to the most vulnerable members of society, whose own suffering most threatens the achievement of the common good. There is also a social aspect to all this: we need to interact with one another in order to create this common good.

Because society is always evolving, the concrete demands of the common good will also evolve. In one time and place it might mean access to food. In other (such as now) it might include access to information through computers or use of radio wave bands. There remain pervasive temptations of individualism and self-interest, so one of the most pressing demands of the common good is the persistent conversion of hearts to the realization that we do not exist for ourselves.

### HELP NEEDED FOR 7th & 8th GRADE SCIENCE FAIR

Parents, grandparents and friends of Saint Ambrose: please consider volunteering to judge projects at our science fair on **November 28<sup>th</sup>**.
