

FROM OUR PASTOR



We have now entered the Easter Season, a 50-day celebration that continues up to the great feast of Pentecost. We might consider 50 days way too long to celebrate, as we tend to gear up for a big day and then dispose of it as we rush on to the next thing. We also tend to create a lot of hoopla, and consider celebration as a time to overindulge in food, drink, entertainment, or even

slothful vegging out. Nathan Mitchell notes that "a season of Christian festival is precisely the opposite. It is a time of intensified consciousness, finely tuned awareness, awakened memory. The great fifty days of Pentecost are not an unwelcome, unrealistic obligation to 'party on,' even if we don't feel like it, but an invitation to explore more deeply 'the weather of the heart,' to awaken our memory of God's presence and power in our lives, to look more closely at all the rich and varied textures of creation. In short, Pentecost [think Easter Season] is a season of learning how to say yes in a culture that wants to keep on saying no." As the resurrection account in Matthew said, he has gone to Galilee ahead of us. We must not tarry at the tomb, that place of death, but go to where we encounter our Easter story. Where are you finding your Galilee?

This weekend we begin celebrating with our 204 First Communicants! These celebrations are being held at our weekend parish Masses, as that is where they will continue to join us in Communion. There will be about ten Masses where we will do this over three weeks, with a maximum of 30 at each one. Some pews will be reserved for them at those Masses the next few weeks, so please let those be used for family and friends. For about 100 years First Communion has usually been celebrated in second grade, although in my first assignment that parish did it in third grade. Prior to the early 1900s it was generally celebrated around the age of 14. For decades after that many communities continued to have the observance of First Solemn Communion, which was generally held near the end of 8th grade.

This Sunday is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. In the gospel Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and says, "whose sins you forgive are forgiven, whose sins you retain are retained." The mercy of the Sacrament of Reconciliation is implied here, and this is among the reasons St. John Paul II gave the name Divine Mercy Sunday to this Sunday within the Octave of Easter. The Divine Mercy chaplet, developed by St. Faustina (1906-1938), is a devotion which many people pray daily at 3:00 p.m.

The Education Advisory Council (EAC) is the primary consultative group in the parish regarding education and faith formation. It meets about ten times a year. There are up to seven parish members on it, as well as the school principal, the director of the Early Childhood Education Center and the director of Faith Formation and pastor. Others may attend from time to time. At this time of the year we rotate off two or three members, and bring on new ones for a three year term. We are accepting nominations at this point, and would invite people to attend our May 1st meeting (Monday at 7:00 p.m.) to observe a meeting. There will be a discernment night on Tuesday, May 9th, again at 7:00 p.m. The EAC is unique in that every other meeting is actually a workshop time where we break into smaller groups to strategize with the various education staff members and move projects forward. If you are as much as doer as an advisor/administrator, and have an interest in faith formation, whether for children or adults, this might be for you. There will be a table in the Commons after Masses this weekend where current members can answer questions.

As mentioned here before, we will be launching a parish magazine, most likely in July. The timing depends on when advertising can be arranged. This will be an attractive, full color magazine which would go to all 3,600+ parish households. It will contain news about the parish as well as articles by nationally known writers. 














• How often does the Council Meet?

The EAC meets a minimum of eight times a year, on the first Monday of the month at 7:00PM. Meeting length may vary, two hours is usual. Meeting dates for the next 12 months are established during the June meeting. Newly elected members' first meeting would be in June as well. There is no meeting in July or September.

All nominees will be asked to participate in a discernment process through which 2 new members will be selected.
