

FROM OUR PASTOR



It is summer, we are through all the Sundays with doctrinal feasts and now celebrate Sundays in ordinary time until Advent. The Sunday readings of Ordinary Time are on a three year cycle. The gospel readings for this year will be from Matthew, the longest gospel, written with Jewish Christians in mind, drawing many images and patterns from the Old Testament. The gospel begins with

two chapters about Jesus' infancy, although this is a gospel in miniature – people choose sides about Jesus, and he is threatened by the powerful. This is the only gospel that tells of the visit of the Magi or the flight into Egypt. In many ways he is compared to Moses.

Once Jesus begins his public ministry, he teaches a great deal about the Kingdom of Heaven. In fact his theme is initially the same as that of John the Baptist. "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Matthew 4:17.) Many parables will begin with "The kingdom of heaven is like" Many people have pointed out five extended discourses by Jesus in the gospel according to Matthew. The first and most famous is the Sermon on the Mount, which is largely about this new age he is introducing, and what it is to be a disciple in it. As we begin the 12th week of Ordinary Time, we drop into his second discourse at Matthew 10:26-33. He has just selected his 12 apostles and is giving them instructions as he sends them out on their first mission. He is warning them of the difficulties of the life of a disciple and the inevitable conflict with the world. We will walk through this for a few weeks and then get into several weeks of parables about the kingdom of God.

Summer is also a time for a number of youth events. First to launch this week is Extreme Faith Camp, which is held at Big Sandy near McGregor in central Minnesota. This is for middle school children with some high school students taking on more of a leadership role. Last year 12 of our youth went. This year it is over 50 – 43 middle schoolers and 9 high school students will join Bri St. Amour and Hector Bautista from our staff. I will join them for a day or two as well. The great increase in numbers is a testament to the experience of last year's attendees, but also to the efforts of our middle school youth leader, Bri St. Amour. Thanks Bri!

Summer Stretch begins this Wednesday as well. Each Wednesday until early August youth will gather here, attend Mass at 8:00 a.m. (those

Wednesday Masses will be in the main church). Shortly after Mass they will go to do service throughout the community. Afternoons will be spent on fun events such as waterparks and conclude with a trip to Valley Fair.

Two other youth events are held this summer. One is the mission trip. We will be part of Catholic Heart Work Camp, which holds events in about 25 cities throughout the country. We will be on one that goes to Michigan. Each day begins with Mass and some inspirational video and talk, and then the teams, comprised of five teens and two adults, go into the community to paint buildings, clean yards, repair walls, supervise children, etc. In the evenings there is club time – music, talks, and parish youth group time. Along the way there is the opportunity for confession, prayer, adoration, etc. I've been on four of these mission trips and found them all worthwhile. The other event is closer to home. It is called Steubenville North and will be held in Rochester, Minnesota. Fr. Froehle will be joining the fifteen high school youth that will attend that more intensive retreat experience.

I was pleased to see 18 people attend the meeting about neighborhood groups. We will be forming a number of these this summer, and you may be getting a call or card from a fellow parishioner inviting you to their home for some gathering. I hope you respond positively. We are always better together than when we are apart.

CYCLES OF FAITH

"Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid." Can it really be true? Is our heavenly Father actually so aware of us? Does the Creator of the universe pay that much attention to me? Jesus says yes. God knows us far more intimately than we even know ourselves. And so, we have nothing to fear.

Being Christian isn't guaranteed to be easy. More and more even in our own culture, following the faith is being criticized and discouraged in the public square. Privately, we may struggle with the demands of the commandments or the ability to believe when we face the inevitable trials that come our way. But passages like this one in today's Gospel are a source of tremendous hope and consolation. We are loved beyond measure. We enjoy the care and concern of God in every situation, big and small. Truly we have no need to worry or be anxious because God is in control.

For our part, of course, Jesus asks us to trust him and stay faithful. He asks us not to apologize for our faith, especially publicly. "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father." When we live our faith with confidence, it's a way of accepting the power and providence of God. But when we try to hide our faith away because we're afraid of causing problems, we only damage our relationship with the One who can actually solve them.

At the end of the day, the only really serious problem we need to worry about is losing our soul-and that, to be sure, is up to us. As the great French novelist Léon Bloy wrote, "There is only one tragedy in the end: not to have been a saint."


